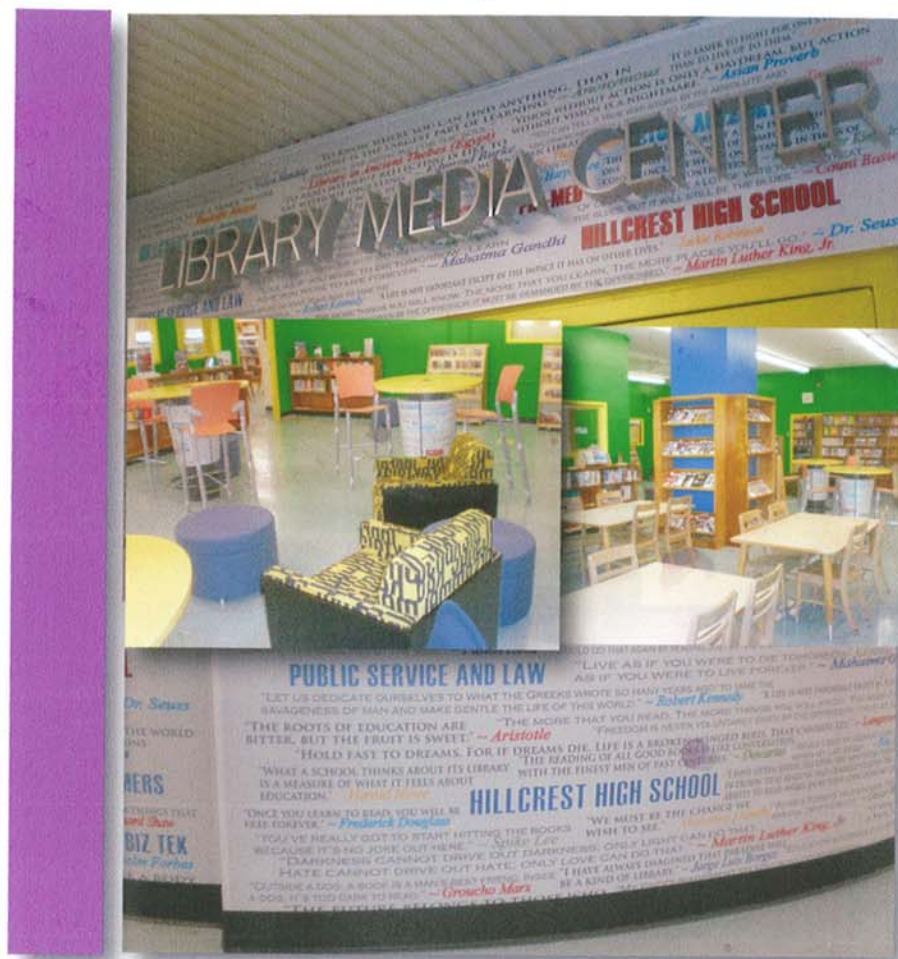

President of the Borough of Queens



About Queens Borough President, Helen M. Marshall

Helen Marshall was overwhelmingly re-elected Queens Borough President in November 2005, winning 74 percent of the vote. She was elected to her first term as Borough President in November 2001 with 68 percent of the vote.

She is the 18th Borough President of Queens and the first African American and second woman to hold the post of highest-ranking elected official in a borough with a population of more than 2.2 million residents.

Since becoming Queens Borough President, Ms. Marshall has allocated more than \$75 million to the Department of Parks and Recreation. Ms. Marshall has also allocated more than \$44 million for new libraries, expansions, additions and technological improvements. In 2005, she was the recipient of the statewide Daniel Casey Library Advocacy Award.

Marshall, a founder of the Langston Hughes Library in Corona, has been a lifelong advocate for public libraries, job training programs and economic development. She was a parent activist in the public school system for 15 years and a member of Community Board 3 for 13 years. She was also a founder of the Queens County Overall Economic Development Corporation. Over the past few years Ms. Marshall has been a supporter of Hillcrest's advances in technology, specifically by allocating funds for laptop carts for the Future Academy.

She has been married to Donald Marshall for more than 50 years and has two children, Donald Jr. and Agnes Marie. Ms. Marshall is also the proud grandmother of Chandler and Chasen, the children of Donald and Charlena.
